

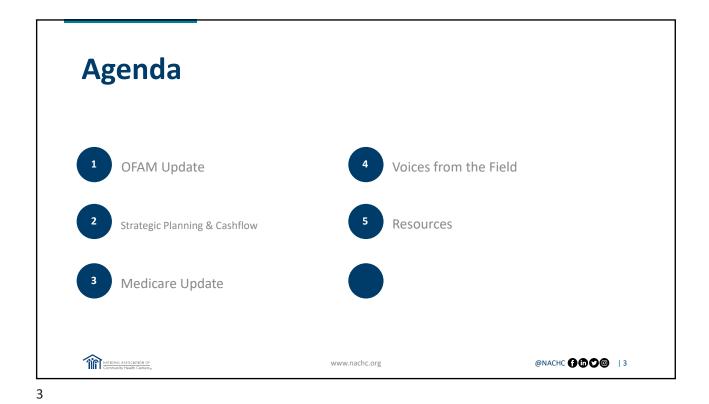

### **Key Fiscal and Grant Management Reminders**

- Account for all funding separately in General Ledger
  H80 (base), H80 (supplemental), H8C, H8D
- Maintain supporting documentation for all expenditures
  - Including pre-award costs (January 20, 2020 date of awards)
- Develop and implement policies and procedures to address unexpected or emergency circumstances
  - Hazard / premium pay, furlough pay, leave policy, reassignment, lost productivity, etc.



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### Key Fiscal and Grant Management Reminders

- Rebudgeting
  - H80 and H8D Prior approval is required if significant rebudgeting
    - exceeds 25% of the total federal budget OR for a line item that HRSA did not approve (i.e. supplies, other)
  - H8C does not require prior approval but must be for allowable costs
- All costs utilizing federal funds need to align with current H80 scope, terms and conditions, and 45 CFR 75 (Cost Principles)
- 45 CFR Part 75 requirements are still applicable and need to be followed unless explicitly stated on the NOA or noted in the OMB flexibilities
  - Single Audit completion and submission flexibility of up to 12 months beyond the normal due date for non-delinquent audits

### Key Fiscal and Grant Management Reminders

- Pre-award Costs (January 20, 2020 date of awards)
  - CANNOT be costs already supported with H80 or H8C funding.
  - Maintain supporting documentation and adjusting journal entries to identify changes in funding source
- Program Income
  - Can only be used for allowable costs
- One-Year Awards —will require a prior approval no cost extension to continue to expend funds beyond the end date of the award
- Refer to HRSA and BPHC FAQ's and staff if you have any questions on allowable and unallowable costs.

# **Grants Management Concepts**

- Uniform Grant Requirements Still Apply
  - Matching Revenue / Expenses in general ledger
    - No Double dipping..
    - Which grant / funding stream should I use first?
    - Break out records from the beginning
      - The reconciliation will come...
  - COVID-19 Extension Concept
    - Vs.
  - 330 Grant carryover concepts
  - Cash Management concepts to remember
    - Cash flow shortages are a practical trap..
    - Minor Alteration / Renovation Considerations

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### **Grants Management Concepts**

- Uniform Grants Guidance Still Applies
  - Procurement and program income reminders
    - Micro Purchase Under \$10,000
    - Small Dollar Between \$10,000 and \$250,000
    - Purchases in excess of Simplified acquisition threshold -\$250,000
  - Time and Effort / System of Internal Controls supporting allocation of salary and wage expense to federal awards
    - Direct care vs. administrative expenses
    - · Budget vs. Actual

# **Grants Management Strategies**

- Budgeting for COVID-19 (H8C) vs CARES Act (H8D)
  - Flexibility to maintain or increase Health Center Capacity during the coronavirus-related public health emergency to Prepare, Prevent, and Respond to Coronavirus
    - COVID-19 pandemic specific expenses
    - Support revenue shortfalls by supporting existing expenses
  - HRSA authorized pre-award expenses dating back to January 20<sup>th</sup>
  - Minor Alteration and Renovation (H8D only)
- Re-budgeting
  - 330 grant (25% or \$250,000)
    - Budget lines with \$0 in federal column

# **FQHC Distant Site Telehealth Services**

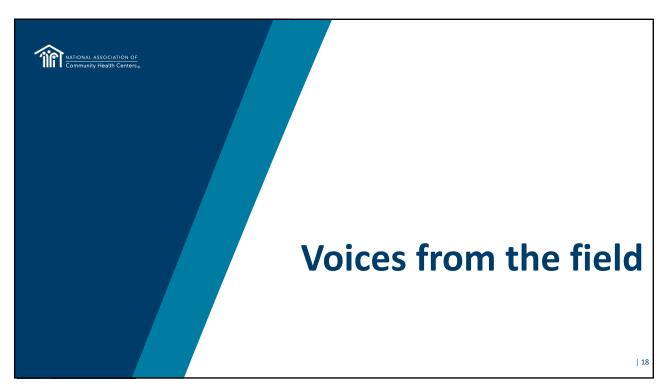
- January 27 to June 30, 2020 Using Modifier 95
- July 1 until the end of COVID-19 Public Health Emergency use the G2020 code
- Reimbursement rate \$92
  - The average amount for all PFS telehealth services
