## ABOUT

The VCHA Community Health Scholarship is for full-time students who are pursuing an MD/DO/DDS degree, NP, PA, or Ph.D./Master's in public health, psychology, and social work at a Virginia college or university. The award amount is \$12,500 for up to three students.

Scholarship recipients are eligible for renewal for up to three additional years and at graduation, they must seek employment with a Virginia CHC and work at the CHC for at least four (4) years.

## ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

**Applicants for the Program must meet the following criteria:**

- Must possess a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale.
- Must file a 2023-2024 Free Application for Federal Student Aid ("FAFSA") Form
- Must have a demonstrated, unmet financial need as verified by their college or university;
- Must be a resident of the Commonwealth of Virginia or attend a college/university within close proximity to the targeted host locations and cities where there are VCHA member organizations and sites.
