Why Open an Entity-Owned Pharmacy

- What are you trying to accomplish?
 - Access to medications
 - Uninsured (slide pricing)
 - Insured (especially brand name drugs)
 - Increased positive patient outcomes
 - Monitoring compliances
 - Collaboration with the provider
 - Profitability
 - Protection from manufacture restrictions
 - Increased capture of prescription written by your providers





How Much?

- What are the costs associated with opening
 - Construction
 - Equipment
 - License, Enrollments
 - Inventory
 - Staffing



Construction Cost

- Must be a minimum of 250 Square Feet
- Minimum recommended: 750-1,000 Sq Ft
- Costs variables include
 - Space required
 - Location, Access
 - Security

This could also affect how long it will take to open the pharmacy





Equipment/Supplies

- Variables
 - Number of Point of Sale
 - Inside pickup, drive-thru
 - Number of workstations
 - Minimum 3
 - Minimum 2 workstations per 150 prescriptions per day
 - 1 workstation for ordering and overflow
 - Printers, scanners,
 - Supplies
 - Refrigerator, data loggers, Will-Call Solution
 - Vials, caps, bottles
 - Bags, Labels, Paper, etc.
 - Counting trays, spatulas



License/Enrollments

- NPI
- NCPDP (\$400)
- State (\$500)
- DEA (\$888)
- Medicaid (\$730.00)
- PSAO
- Humana
- Caremark (\$1,200.00)
- Express Scripts (\$500.00)



Inventory

- Open Door vs Closed Door
 - o 340B only or a mixed inventory





Staffing (Annual Cost)

- Pharmacist
 - \$150,000 \$175,000
- Technician
 - o \$45,000 \$60,000
- Clerks/Patient Service Reps
 - o \$30,000 \$40,000



How Long

- 6 months to 1 year
- Cadence of License/enrollments
 - License
 - Network enrollments
 - Vendors (wholesaler)



Where Do You Start

- Feasibility
- Timing
- Location
- Hiring





Needed Data

- Board of Directors and Leadership information
 - Name, DOB, SS number, Physical Address, for officers (when they started in that position)
- Banking information
- Policy on timely submission
- Proof of Liability and general insurance
- Statement of ownership by an FQHC that is 340B eligible
- Policy on waiving/adjusting copays
- Federal tax ID document
- Articles of Incorporation, Certificate of incorporation, Fictitious Name document, Organizational Chart



Things to Consider

- Adding pharmacy in scope with BPHC
- Adding pharmacy as a ship to address on OPAIS
- Informing 340B ESP that you now have and entity-owned pharmacy
- HEAT zone implications (MedImpact)
- Operating capital as the pharmacy begins dispensing
- MTF Enrollment
